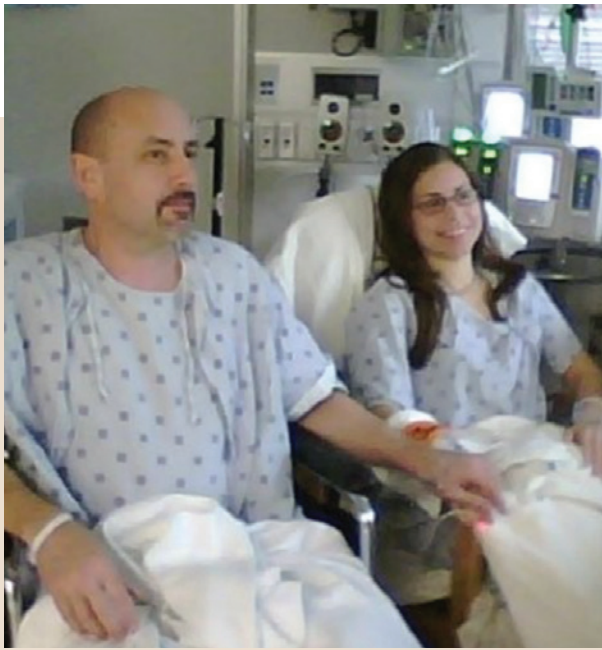
Over 81% of individuals on the National Organ Transplant Waiting List are waiting for a kidney. In response to the shortage of deceased donor kidneys, relatives, loved ones, friends and even individuals who wish to remain anonymous may serve as living kidney donors. Living-donor kidney transplantation allows an individual to donate one of two healthy kidneys to a kidney failure patient.

LIVING KIDNEY TRANSPLANT RECIPIENT'S REMARKABLE STORY

Leslie is a beautiful young woman who came close to dying when she was a child. She was not a sick child, rarely ever missing a day of school. One morning when Leslie was 8-years old she became gravely ill and was transported by a Life Flight helicopter to Texas Children's Hospital where she was diagnosed with meningococcal meningitis.

Fighting the battle to live, Leslie spent two months in the hospital, where she was in a coma and on life support. Slowly her body began to recover from the meningitis everything that is, except her kidneys.

Leslie was originally told that she would need



a kidney transplant at age 16, but with a very strict diet and positive lifestyle choices, Leslie was able to hold off transplantation for an additional two years. At 18, Leslie began the pre-transplant tests. She learned that her dad was an excellent match and he donated a kidney to her, which they affectionately named Neal after her father's middle name.

Today, Leslie is a student in Health Communications, Biochemistry and Pre-med at the University of Houston. Her long-term goals include medical school and a master's in public health, with a focus on chronic pediatric illnesses and healthcare economics.



There are places in your heart you don't even know exist until you love a child.

Two of the small miracles whose stories were told at our October 24th event were Gavin Morgan and Cooper Hanks. Both received their lifesaving transplant at Texas Children's Hospital.

♥ Cooper Hanks is a miracle baby. Cooper was diagnosed with Biliary Atresia a life-threatening condition. At 16-months, Cooper needed and received a liver transplant. He is now a healthy 4-year old who has lots of energy. Cooper's mom, Kristen shared with our audience, "I still check his eyes every day to see if he's okay. I think I'll do that forever! At first his Dad and I asked why this was happening. Transplant saved Cooper's life and what a miracle that is. We believe that Cooper will grow up with an appreciation of organ donors and life."



Gavin Morgan, holding a cow bell led the way to the stage opening the event stating, "please be seated, thank you." His mom and dad, Heather and Wade, learned that Gavin had a life-threatening hole in his heart before he was born. At the age of 3 months, he received a heart transplant at Texas Children's Hospital. Gavin is now 8 years old and his mom says, "it's hard to keep up with him."
